



Who are we?



Unity Mining Limited (ASX: UML) is an Australian gold explorer and producer which owns and operates the Henty Gold Mine on the West Coast of Tasmania and is involved in gold exploration in West Africa through its investment in GoldStone Resources Limited. Unity has also explored the Bendigo Goldfield in Victoria and owns the Kangaroo Flat Mine.

The Company's goal is to be a successful mid-tier gold mining company, operating multiple mines in a responsible manner and achieving strong financial returns. Our strategy is to discover, operate and acquire quality gold assets in Australasia and West Africa to transform the Company into a mid-tier gold producer. We will do this by:

- Motivating and developing our people to maximise the performance of our existing activities.
- Exploring directly and in partnership with others.
- Developing, acquiring and investing in projects where we can add value.
- Demonstrating integrity and commitment in everything we do.

The Henty Gold Mine was acquired in July 2009 and has produced in excess of one million ounces of gold over a 15 year period.

The Henty Gold Mine, an underground gold mine that commenced operation in 1996, is located in glaciated mountainous terrain in the upper Henty Valley on the West Coast of Tasmania, adjacent to the Southwest Conservation Area. The nearest main towns are Rosebery, 10 km to the north; Zeehan, 19 km to the west; and Queenstown, 23 km to the south.

The Kangaroo Flat Mine site is located on the urban fringe of Bendigo, in the suburb of Kangaroo Flat. Bendigo is a thriving rural city with a population of 100,000, located 125 km northwest of Melbourne in the Central Victorian Goldfields. The Bendigo Goldfield is the second largest historical gold producing field in Australia (after Kalgoorlie's Golden Mile) with historic production of 22 million ounces of gold from over a century of mining. The Kangaroo Flat Mine has been on care and maintenance since mining ceased in April 2011 and processing was subsequently concluded in May 2011.

This report has been prepared based on the GRI-G3 Sustainability Reporting Guidelines, including the Mining and Metals Sector Supplement, and reviews Unity Mining's economic, social and environmental performance for the

period 1 July 2010 to 30 June 2011. The report covers the activities at the Henty Gold Mine and the Kangaroo Flat Mine during the reporting period.

The data generated for this report has been collated and analysed, and is publically disseminated with the objective of:

- Informing stakeholders of management actions and strategies.
- Assessing the Company's progress against targets and objectives.
- Facilitating benchmarking of performance.
- Communicating performance with stakeholders.
- Meeting legislative and corporative governance requirements.
- Maintaining the Company's social licence to operate.

Transparent reporting of our performance forms an important part of our strategic commitment to sustainable development and is aligned with our goal of being a respected mining company which operates according to a strong set of values.

Introduction

Welcome to Unity Mining's 11th annual Sustainability Report. This report is prepared each year to inform the community and other stakeholders of our activities and outcomes in the areas of safety, health, environment and community. Its aim is to provide a comprehensive review of our sustainability performance for the 2010/11 financial year.

The past year has seen the Company change its name from Bendigo Mining to Unity Mining Limited. The main focus for the Company has been extending the life of the Henty Gold mine in Tasmania through a significant exploration program. The investment in exploration has been successful with the discovery of the Newton Zone, which may support a mine life of more than four years.

In April 2011 a decision was made to cease operations at the Kangaroo Flat Mine as exploration at the southern end of the historic goldfield was unable to provide sufficient process plant feed to economically sustain operations. However, work on the Bendigo exploration licences is continuing under a farm-in arrangement with ASX-listed Drummond Gold. This will enable the Company to continue to focus exploration efforts on further discoveries at Henty, whilst benefitting from any new exploration success that Drummond may have on the Bendigo regional exploration leases.

Sound operational performance, combined with a strong gold price, has provided the financial capacity to support growth of the Company through focussed exploration and capital investment. The Company has a strong balance sheet and diversified exploration and production portfolio, and is well positioned to pursue further growth opportunities.

The Company is committed to reducing injury rates through the ongoing implementation of its safety management system. The implementation of the "I Own Safety" program at Henty in late 2010 served as a refresher on workplace safety basics and provided a behaviour based safety approach. The lost time injury frequency rate (LTIFR) for FY11 at Henty was


14.7, compared to 21.4 the previous reporting period. The medically referred injury frequency rate (MRIFR) was 39.3, compared to 42.7 in the previous reporting period. We continue to strive for improvement in our safety performance. The Kangaroo Flat Mine reported a higher number of LTIFR and MRIFR of 26.7 and 53.5 respectively. These numbers are somewhat skewed following the significant reduction in full time staff members working at the mine.

Compliance with limits prescribed in our environmental monitoring programs improved over the year at the Kangaroo Flat Mine with a total of 8 non-compliances in FY10 versus 9 for the previous reporting period. At the Henty Gold Mine, 17 environmental non-compliances were reported. Whilst reasonably high levels of compliance have been achieved over the period, we recognise that further work needs to be done to ensure environmental impacts are minimised.

Greenhouse gas emissions attributed to Unity Mining's operations decreased by 15% compared to last year due to the Kangaroo Flat mine being placed on care and maintenance in May 2011.

One of our key corporate objectives is to work diligently to ensure we maintain and enhance our social licence to operate within the communities in which we operate. We will continue to measure and monitor our performance and to work closely with the community, local government and state regulators. I once again offer my sincere thanks to our local communities for their support and I look forward to continually enhancing this relationship into the future.

Health and Safety

Unity Mining is committed to operating in a safe and responsible manner, respecting the health of our employees, the environment and the communities in which we operate.

Whilst we have maintained a strong emphasis on health and safety at our operations, we recognise there continues to be opportunities to reduce injury rates and ensure that employees' behaviours are aligned to proactively identify hazards in the workplace and drive continued improvement in our safety performance.

In late 2010, it was decided that an alternative approach to behavioural based safety may be of benefit. The Health & Safety department at Henty Mine set about developing what came to be known as the "I Own Safety" program. With a goal of reminding personnel of the real reason as to why it is important to stay safe at work, "I Own Safety" was rolled out in a series of half day seminars early in 2011. Two hundred Unity Mining employees and contractors attended the sessions, which comprised refreshers on some workplace safety basics (Field Level Risk

Assessment, Hazard Reporting, Incident Investigation) as well as some timely case studies of recent and relevant incidents from mining and other heavy industries. It is intended that in order to keep the concepts fresh in the minds of all personnel, refresher sessions will be conducted on a regular basis. The I Own Safety brand will also serve as a constant reminder to all personnel that the real reason for their being safe at work has nothing to do with work at all, it is all about what they want to do outside of work.

Emergency Preparedness

The Emergency Response Team at the Henty mine undertakes regular training with the aim of maintaining a skilled pool of personnel who are able to provide emergency response capability in the event of a significant incident occurring on site.

The Emergency Response Team has significantly increased its capability over the course of the year through a range of training programs including search and rescue techniques, the use of both open and closed circuit breathing apparatus, fire fighting and rope rescue. The team also maintains key emergency response equipment such as an underground ambulance, emergency egress infrastructure and search and rescue equipment.

During the year, the Henty Emergency Response Team competed in the Victorian Underground Mine Rescue Competition which attracts participants from mine sites across the country, and takes place over three days. The teams are confronted with highly realistic mine rescue scenarios, which incorporate the use of make-up artists and live volunteers to ensure that teams get to deal with injuries and situations that are as realistic as possible. The team performed extremely well throughout the event demonstrating a significant improvement in their skill level compared to previous years.

Henty Gold Mine is a signatory to an Emergency Response Mutual Aid Agreement in Tasmania, which enables the mines in the area to draw upon mine rescue team resources from nearby mining operations in the event of an emergency. The Mutual Aid Agreement significantly strengthens each mine's emergency response capability and provides an environment for sharing of skills.

Connecting with our Community

to the Southwest Conservation Area on Tasmania's West Coast. Whilst the mine doesn't have any near neighbours, the mine and its employees play a very important role in supporting the local community and economy, in addition to the environment.

Henty Biological Stream Monitoring Program



The Henty Gold Mine is located in remote and pristine mountainous terrain adjacent to the Southwest Conservation Area on the West Coast of Tasmania. An artificial wetland for water treatment was constructed in 1996 which discharges treated water into the Henty River in accordance with criteria prescribed by the Environment Protection Authority. Comprehensive environmental monitoring programs are established at the mine site to ensure that the environmental values of this distinctive area are protected. Annual biological monitoring is carried out by specialist consultants at sites in the upper Henty River and in Newton Creek near the mine site. This program, now in its 19th year, involves monitoring of fish and benthic macroinvertebrates (organisms without backbones that live on the river bed) in the autumn to early winter period.

This long term program has shown marked fluctuation in macroinvertebrate community composition, abundance and diversity largely driven by the incidence and severity of low summer flows in these small catchments.

The 2011 survey once again indicated the absence of a substantial impact from mine infrastructure and that the upper Henty River continues to maintain moderate to high macroinvertebrate diversity and abundance, and a self-sustaining population of native fish (climbing galaxias) and brook trout.

Henty

Since acquiring the Henty Gold Mine in July 2009, Unity Mining has undertaken an extensive, strategic surface drilling program within 5 km of the mine site. Surface diamond drilling commenced in December 2009 with the aim of extending existing high grade orebodies, and exploring for new and discrete gold zones within the mining and exploration licence areas.

The surface drilling program at Henty, approved by Mineral Resources Tasmania, is being undertaken in accordance with the Tasmanian Mineral Exploration Code of Practice. The drill sites are in remote and mountainous terrain, featuring unique flora and fauna. Potential environmental impacts are carefully assessed by Henty environmental staff to ensure that disturbance from the drilling program is kept to a minimum.

Unity Mining's Henty Gold Mine has been proactive in maintaining strong community ties with several towns on the West Coast of Tasmania, and enjoys a positive and mutually rewarding relationship with a number of schools, organisations and local community groups. Kangaroo Flat Mine Environment Fund

Established in 1995, the Kangaroo Flat Mine Environment Fund aims to provide funding to assist organisations with environmental projects that benefit the Bendigo community. The Environment Fund is administered by a Committee and chaired by the Mayor of the City of Greater Bendigo. Members of the Committee include Unity Mining's Managing Director and up to three external community members with expertise in environmental management.

Criteria for sponsorship includes the ability to contribute to the biodiversity of the local area, establish self-sustaining land management practices, reduce the impact of invasive species, raise awareness of key environmental issues within the local community, promote the efficient use of water, energy and natural resources or reduce waste, provide an environmental benefit for the Bendigo community, support volunteer groups and provide opportunities to publically recognise Unity Mining's contribution to the project.

Environmental Performance

Unity Mining recognises that responsible environmental stewardship is essential to long-term success. Through effective management practices we aim to minimise our impact on the environment, make efficient use of natural resources and ensure that the footprint of our operations is as small as possible.

Unity Mining's Kangaroo Flat Mine operations are located within regrowth box-ironbark forest, agricultural farmland and the urban development of the city of Bendigo. The Company respects the cultural significance of the Bendigo region for the Dja Dja Wurrung People and is a signatory to an Indigenous Land Use Agreement on Exploration Licence EL5035.

The Henty Gold Mine is located adjacent to the cool temperate rainforest of the south-west conservation area on the West Coast of Tasmania.

Environmental monitoring programs are in place at both mine sites which focus on collecting and assessing data associated with water quality, noise, air quality, blast vibration, odour, soil, groundwater and revegetation. Closure plans have been developed for all operations to ensure that current and future activities do not compromise agreed rehabilitation plans.

Independent auditors are engaged to verify environmental monitoring data to ensure the accuracy of results. Environmental performance is measured in terms of compliance against regulatory limits and conformance against the approved monitoring program which is summarised in the Sustainability Measures Table at the end of this report.

A comprehensive Environment Management System, aligned to ISO 14001, drives continuous improvement initiatives to ensure environmental impacts are identified and risks are assessed and appropriately managed. Information dissemination to employees is initially undertaken through the Company's induction program and then reinforced through regular toolbox meetings to allow employees to take ownership of their role in Unity Mining's environmental obligations.

During the reporting period 8 environmental non-compliances were reported at Kangaroo Flat Mine and 17 at Henty Mine.

The Future

Unity ceased mining at Kangaroo Flat Mine in April 2011, with the focus on gold production at Henty Gold Mine.

The focus at Henty is on building resources in the respective mining and exploration lease areas, with the aim of delivering a reliable and growing base of gold production.

The Company's investment in West African gold explorer GoldStone Resources provides an exciting opportunity to further diversify its gold interests with an experienced explorer in this highly prospective region. The Strategic Alliance with GoldStone provides Unity Mining with exploration exposure in Ghana, Senegal and Gabon, with the potential for future production opportunities.

The Company is continuing to look beyond its existing assets for opportunities to further expand and grow the business, and is seeking select opportunities where it can leverage its 10 years of underground mining and exploration experience.

Our focus on health and safety will continue to be integral to all our activities. We recognise that safe work environments are fundamental to our business, but equally vital are the right attitudes and behaviours which create a safe workplace culture. The Company is working on further developing the capability of the Henty Emergency Response team and enhancing the effectiveness of its Emergency Response plans.

We are confident that our persistent approach to exploration, development and assessment of expansion opportunities will be rewarded and we will be able to develop a long-life gold mining business in keeping with the principles of sustainable development.

This Sustainability Report covers the period from July 2010 to June 2011.
